# The Apostle John in His 90's—Lessons in Aging Faithfully

The apostle John was known as the *disciple whom Jesus loved* (John 21:7). What I find personal in this statement is that I feel the same way! I am loved by Jesus, King of King, and Lord of Lords! As believers in Christ,:

We can have the same confidence in the birthright and opportunity to know Jesus more intimately!

How did John's letters to the seven churches get to them? Even though we don't have all the details, we know these seven letters and the book of Revelation, as we know it, made it back!

May we live this season of our lives to the fullest, with passion and purpose, keeping our eyes focused on Jesus and passing along our faith to the next generation!
