Are You More Like Charlie Brown, Snoopy, or Linus this Christmas?

I am fond of "A Charlie Brown Christmas" that aired for the first time on December 9, 1965. *Koinonia Senior Care* (KSC) was blessed to have a generous artist create and donate a wood cut-out of the characters for our "Old Fashioned Christmas" in 2017. All Size Sheds made us a Snoopy doghouse to add to our scene. Now KSC uses it for special occasions such as Goddard's "*Christmas on Main Street*" to share the CHRISTmas story.

In "A Charlie Brown Christmas," Charlie Brown's sarcasm and sadness over no cards in his mailbox and the commercialization of even Snoopy decorating his doghouse with lights in celebration of the "modern spirit" puts him in a depressed mood and on a search for purpose and meaning at Christmas time.

At psychiatrist Lucy's suggestion, he tries "involvement" as the Director of the Christmas play to remedy his sadness. Cooperation is at an all-time low for the cast so Charlie Brown thinks that a Christmas tree will set a better mood for the experience. The gang laugh at his tree, and in frustration and exhaustion, Charlie Brown begs, "Doesn't anyone know what Christmas is all about?" Then Linus, who can't memorize even one line of the script, saves the day by reciting the real meaning of Christmas from Luke 2:8-14 on center stage with the lights on him.

⁸And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them; and they were sore afraid. ¹⁰And the angel said unto them, Fear not; for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. ¹¹For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. ¹²And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a man ger. ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, ¹⁴Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men. (KJV)

When Linus had finished, Charlie Brown finally had a sense of peace and HOPE in his heart that radiated in his smile as he took his humble tree home and set it in the yard next to Snoopy's 1st Place commercialized doghouse. Charlie Brown walked into the house, not knowing the gang followed him home. Linus realizes that all this tree needs is a little love as he wraps his security blanket around the base of the tree. The gang proceed to embellish this tree with Snoopy's decorations, and then start humming "Hark the Herald Angels Sing." Charlie Brown hears them and comes out of his house to a great celebration of singing around the tree.
