The Gift of End of Life Care

It is bittersweet when our loved ones who know the Lord prepare for their homegoing. It's bitter because we won't have them with us here on earth anymore. It's sweet because we know they are in heaven with Jesus and are certainly not suffering as they did here on earth. And as Christ-followers, we'll see them again.

Family decorated their loved one's viewing area with Christmas wonder, at her request. They played music. They shared memories. They cried. They prayed. They hugged. 
