## Caregiver's Corner

I wish I could have spent more time with Mom as her daughter, not her caregiver.

This voiced regret came recently as a daughter was burying her mother. It's not uncommon. One daughter asked a hospice volunteer about her last visit with her father. She said, "He was very weak. We sat on the couch and held hands, and I read him the paper." The daughter felt a bolt of jealousy. My dad and I never held hands.

One daughter admitted it was the words *not* spoken and simple deeds left undone that filled her with remorse, so here's some seeds to sow:

Give more touch, hugs, hand-holding, massages, kisses, and "I love you's."

Express gratitude for teaching you to ride your bike, drive a car, being your biggest fan, and other positive affirmations instead of negative-toned words.

Share more simple pleasures together: a drive, a sunset, a cup of coffee or tea, Sunday dinners, game night, puzzles, ice cream, and sleeping next to them.

Avoid martyrhood; Get respite. Invite their friends to visit & share a meal. Ask them to journal stories shared. Encourage phone calls, Facetime, & mail.

### THE SEED - THE SOIL - THE SOUL - THE FRUIT

Have you noticed the wheat fields sprouting and growing?! Good soil, rain, and sunshine will help these budding crops grow and produce a great harvest for our farmers! Farming has been around since the beginning of time. When Jesus talked with His audience, He sometimes spoke in a farming lingo they could relate to. He would talk to them about the Word of God being like **the seed of God's Good News!** 

As a youngster, did you enjoy going barefoot through the yard, the dirt, the mud puddles, and off the beaten path? But, OUCH when you stepped on a sticker or a little pebble or you stubbed your toe on something! That's kind of the way it is when **the seed of God's Good News** falls on different types of ground when it is scattered across the fields. The path seeds became food for the birds. The seeds that land on shallow deceiving soil with rocks under it, sprout and wilt quickly under the sun since they have no deep roots. The seeds that fell around the stickers grew but were then choked out by the thorns. That leaves the farmer with the seeds that fell on fertile soil. They can produce a crop that is 30-60-100 times more than what was planted! That's some good fruit, right there!

Jesus said, "Anyone with ears to hear should listen and understand." He wasn't talking about ears of corn, here either. He was talking about spiritual ears. When we listen with our soul - our spirit - to the **seeds of God's Good News,** we are rewarded with more understanding and knowledge about the Kingdom of Heaven, creating in us a desire to be exponentially productive for the Kingdom.

Jesus explains it like this in Matthew 13:19-23 (NIV): <sup>19</sup> The seed that fell on the footpath represents those who hear the message about the Kingdom and don't understand it. Then the evil one comes and snatches away the seed that was planted in their hearts. <sup>20</sup> The seed on the rocky soil represents those who hear the message and immediately receive it with joy. <sup>21</sup> But since they don't have deep roots, they don't last long. They fall away as soon as they have problems or are persecuted for believing God's word. <sup>22</sup> The seed that fell among the thorns represents those who hear God's word, but all too quickly the message is crowded out by the worries of this life and the lure of wealth, so no fruit is produced. <sup>23</sup> The seed that fell on good soil represents those who truly hear and understand God's word and produce a harvest of thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times as much as had been planted!"

Matthew Henry's Bible Commentary said, "Worldly cares are great hinderances to our profiting by the word of God. The deceitfulness of riches does the mischief; they cannot be said to deceive us unless we put our trust in them, then they choke the good seed. What distinguished the good ground was fruitfulness...and let us look to ourselves that we may know what sort of hearers we are."

This month's Blessing Gift is some soil and a packet of seeds for planting flowers, reminding us that *the grass* withers and the flowers fade, but the Word of God stands forever. Isaiah 40:8. Ponder the seed of God's Word. Prepare the soil of your soul. Produce fruit for the Kingdom. Thank a farmer while you're at it!

### PRAYER FOR TODAY

Our Creator God, You tell us in Genesis 8:22 that as long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease. In Matthew 13 You tell us how to produce fruit. In Luke 10:2 you tell us that the harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Open our spiritual eyes for ways we can labour for the Kingdom of Heaven and be a fruitful part of the harvest. We pray Your abundant favour among Your labourers. In Jesus' name, AMEN.
