Mother's Day Ideas

For those whose mothers have passed, Mother's Day can still be celebrated as you remember the recipes, sayings, aromas, and other special things that made your relationship with your mom memorable. Decorating her grave is another meaningful way to commemorate her memory.

For those whose mothers are still with us, we often find that, as our mom's age, they don't need more "stuff," so, besides flowers, what can we get a woman who has all she needs? Finding gifts for mom (or the wife) that are unique and different and finding gifts that create a special memory are top priorities when considering choices that show you care and that they are loved.

Remembering the <u>5 Love Languages</u> might be a helpful way to think about gifts, depending on her dominant love language:

- Words of affirmation your hand-written letter sharing your love and appreciation with specific examples will personalize your letter and deepen your relationship.
- **Physical Touch** spa day, massage, waxing, tweezing whiskers, rubbing lotion on legs & arms, or a head massage before a hair appointment are ways to bring human touch to those who may seldom have any other daily physical touch.
- Receiving Gifts subscriptions, memberships, gift card for a décor store or coffee shop, new tea-towels, purse, or wallet, or even more personalized and appreciated is to create a DVD from family pictures.
 They will watch it over and over!
- Acts of Service—Who wouldn't like someone to clean, declutter, organize, add slide-out drawers, cook her favorites, or do some gardening and/or yardwork for her! Many times moms don't want to "bother" their kids for such things because their lives are busy. Do it anyway.
- **Quality Time** -"Together" attend events, take her to church, go shopping together, shop at Nifty Nuthouse together, plan a picnic together, watch a movie on TV together, learn a new skill together, take a class together, go for a drive together, or take them to the cemetery to decorate the graves,


