Ice Cream in a Bag

- 1 C. heavy cream OR half and half
- 1/2 t. vanilla extract or flavoring of choice
- 1 T sugar
- Ice & 1/4 C. rock salt "Ice cream salt"
- Toppings of choice
- Ziplock bags: 1 quart, 1 gallon



- 1. Pour 1 C of half-and-half into a small Ziploc bag.
- 2. Add 1/2 t. vanilla extract and 1 T. sugar
- 3. Seal the bag firmly and get any excess air out.
- 4. In the larger Ziploc bag, fill it about 1/2 way with ice. Add 1/4 C. salt.
- 5. Add your small bag inside the large bag and fill with extra ice on top. Seal the large bag.
- 6. Use gloves for shaking and shake (or toss in a circle) for 6 minutes.
- 7. Use a spoon to mix and add toppings as desired. Scoop out and enjoy!
- 8. Take the small bag out and rinse the outside of it, including the seal, with cold water.
